**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 AMENDED  
BUDGET FOR HARRISVILLE CITY, UTAH, FISCAL YEAR  
ENDING JUNE 30, 2023.**

**WHEREAS**, Harrisville City (hereafter referred to as the “City”) is a municipal corporation duly existing under the laws of the state of Utah;

**WHEREAS**, Utah Code Annotated §10-6-128, as amended, states in effect:

“After the conclusion of the hearing, the governing body, by resolution or ordinance, may amend the budgets of the funds proposed to be increased, so as to make all or part of the increases therein, both estimated revenues and appropriations, which were the proper subject of consideration at the hearing. Final amendments in the current period to the budgets of any of the funds set forth in Section 10-6-109 shall be adopted by the governing body on or before the last day of the fiscal period.”

**WHEREAS**, the City adopted its Fiscal Year 2023 budget previously and desires to amend that budget according to the terms of the amended budget presented herein, with the referenced changes;

**WHEREAS**, Title 10, Chapter 6, of the Utah Code Annotated provides the procedure for the City to amend its budget;

**WHEREAS**, the legislative body, in accordance with state law, held its public hearing on June 13, 2023, to take public comment regarding the amended budget for the above referenced fiscal year and such budget was presented as contained herein;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the City Council of Harrisville City as follows:

**Section 1. Budget Amendment.**

That the Harrisville City Council amends the budget for FY 2023 as per the attached budgetary forms incorporated herein by this reference, with the changes indicated therein.

**Section 2. Compliance and Submission.**

That staff is authorized to make any modification to said budget to conform with the submission requirements of state law. That said amended budget adopted herein in accordance with the requirements of the laws of the state of Utah shall be immediately forwarded by staff to the State Auditor within thirty (30) days.

**Section 3. Effective Date.**

This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and adoption.

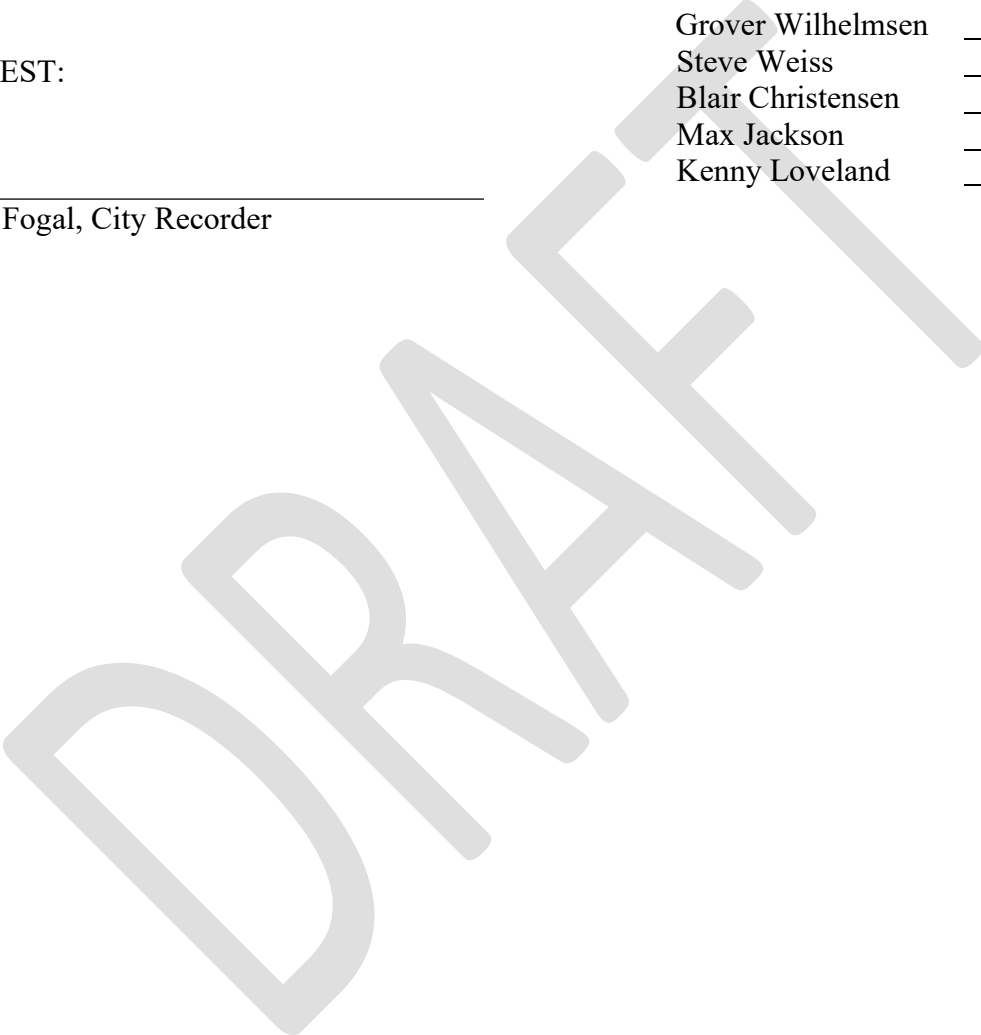

**LAND USE AND UTILITY FEES AMENDED**

**AN ORDINANCE OF HARRISVILLE CITY, UTAH, AMENDING SECTIONS 1.85.010 RELATING TO LAND USE FEES, 1.85.020 RIGHT OF WAY FEES, 1.85.030 MUNICIPAL SERVICE FEES, 1.85.060 STREET LIGHT UTILITY FEE, 1.85.070 SANITARY SEWER UTILITY FEE, 8.01.050 PLAN CHECK FEE, AND 10.12.030 STORM WATER UTILITY FEE; MAKING TECHNICAL CHANGES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, Harrisville City (hereafter referred to as “City”) is a municipal corporation, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Utah;

**WHEREAS**, *Utah Code Annotated* §10-8-84 and §10-8-60 authorizes the City to exercise certain police powers and nuisance abatement powers, including but not limited to providing for safety and preservation of health, promotion of prosperity, improve community well-being, peace and good order for the inhabitants of the City;

**WHEREAS**, the City is adopting Harrisville Resolution 23-10; Harrisville City Consolidated Fee Schedule to consolidate fees associated with land use and utilities;

**WHEREAS**, the City deems it to be in the best interest of public health, safety, and welfare to update and impose certain utility fees through the Harrisville City Consolidated Fee Schedule to meet the challenge of providing sustainable services for the same as set forth in this Ordinance;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the City Council of Harrisville City as follows:

**Section 1:**       **Repealer.** Any word other, sentence, paragraph, or phrase inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed and any reference thereto is hereby vacated.

**Section 2:**       **Amendment.** Section 1.85.010, 1.85.020, 1.85.030, 1.85.060, 1.85.070, 8.01.050, and 10.12.030 of the *Harrisville Municipal Code* are hereby amended to read as follows:

**1.85.010       Community Development and Land Use Fees**

~~The following fees apply for land use applications and related matters:—~~

- ~~1. Subdivision fees. Subdivision and parcel related fees shall be as follows:~~
  - ~~a. Subdivision application (preliminary and minor lot, due on application).  
\$2000 + \$50 per lot~~
  - ~~b. Subdivision application (final review): 5% of the cost of improvements.~~
    - ~~i. The applicant for a final subdivision review shall pay a fee of \$90 per lot to initiate the city review.~~
    - ~~ii. This fee per lot shall apply toward the final subdivision review fee which is required to be paid prior to recording of the final plat, or included as part of the escrow to be drawn by the city.~~
  - ~~c. Subdivision research: \$35 (per hour)~~
  - ~~d. Lot line adjustment (within subdivision): \$150~~

- e. ~~Boundary line adjustment (not in subdivision): \$100~~
- f. ~~Amendment to existing subdivision after final acceptance: \$100 + \$25 per unit~~
- g. ~~Combine parcels: \$20~~
- h. ~~Expired subdivision reapplication fee: \$1500~~

Fees are established by Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule and may be updated from time to time by City Council.

**1.85.20 Right-Of-Way Fees**

- 5. Fee. The fees for applications or projects involving the public right-of-way ~~shall be as follows. are established by the Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.~~ The Public Works Director is hereby delegated the authority to reduce or waive the fee requirement for local entities who “self-perform “utility work without enlisting or contracting with a third-party.
  - a. ~~Permit Fee: \$500. Subject to inspection by the City to assure that a project meets the proper standards, fees are waived where a property owner is installing or replacing curb, gutter, or sidewalk.~~
  - b. ~~Road Cut Fee: \$750, and 25 cents per square foot.~~
- 6. ~~Other Right of Way Fees:-~~
  - a. ~~Road Boring Fee: \$500~~
  - b. ~~Curb, Gutter, and Sidewalk Cut: \$150~~
  - e. ~~Subject to inspection by the City to assure that to a project meets the proper standards, fees are waived where a property owner is installing or replacing curb, gutter, or sidewalk.~~
- 7. ~~6.~~ Penalties. The following penalties apply.
  - a. Civil. A violation of this section or operating without a permit under this section is a fine ~~not to exceed \$1,000, per day, that a violation continues.~~ established by the Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.
  - b. Criminal. A violation of this section or operating without a permit under this section is a class B misdemeanor with a fine ~~not to exceed \$1,000, per day, that a violation continues.~~ established by the Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.

**1.85.030 Municipal Service Fees**

- 12. Facility rental fees, parks and recreation fees, building permit fees, storm water fees, sewer rates, residential solid waste collection and disposal fees, impact fees, and any other fees are established by separate ordinance, ~~or resolution,~~ or Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.

**1.85.060 Street Light Utility Fee**

Any prior utility fee already being collected by the City are hereby classified for the “street light utility fee” as provided in this part. A monthly utility fee for City operated street lighting installation, operation, and maintenance, per lot/unit is hereby ~~imposed not to exceed the amounts as follows:~~ established by the Harrisville City Consolidated Fee Schedule.

**1.85.070 Sanitary Sewer Utility Fee.**

- 1. Residential. ~~A monthly residential sanitary sewer utility fee is hereby imposed in the amount of~~

~~\$27.05, per unit.~~ All persons and associations connected to a sewer as required in this chapter shall pay such maintenance and usage fees and charges as established by the Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.

2. ~~Commercial. A monthly commercial sanitary sewer utility fee is hereby imposed in the amount of \$24.05, per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) for each commercial use based upon industry standards.~~ All corporations and associations connected to a sewer as required in this chapter shall pay such maintenance and usage fees and charges as established by the Harrisville City consolidated fee schedule.

**8.01.050 Plan Check Fees**

2. Plan Check Fees. A plan check fee is hereby imposed on all building permits as follows:

**Section 3:** Severability. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any part of this ordinance is unconstitutional or invalid, then such portion of the ordinance, or specific application of the ordinance, shall be severed from the remainder, which shall continue in full force and effect.

**Section 4:** Effective date. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon posting after final passage, approval, and posting.

Dear Mayor Michelle Tait,

Central Weber Sewer Improvement District is required to upgrade facilities to meet water quality regulations by the Utah Department of Environmental Quality and the US Environmental Protection Agency. It is estimated that the upgrade projects will cost nearly \$100,000,000 and must be completed prior to 2026. The District is capable of paying for much of this required work without bonding. However, bonding is still required and the District is planning on bonding for \$35,000,000 during the 2024 Fiscal Year. It is necessary for the District to raise service fees in order to complete all of these projects.

The Central Weber Sewer Improvement District Board of Trustees will consider an increase to the service fees which will go into effect on July 1, 2023, if approved. The new fees include a 5% increase and adjustments have been made to individual cities based on population and assessed property values.

In addition, sewer impact fees will increase on July 1, 2023 to \$2,631.00.

It has been a pleasure serving the citizens of Harrisville during the past year. Waste Management sincerely values your patronage and looks forward to continuing our partnership. Per the agreement, this letter serves as notification of rate adjustments effective July 1, 2023. Rates will be adjusted as outlined below:

### **Summary of Adjustments**

- CPI – As published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Water, Sewer and Trash Collection Services index, for the prior calendar year reflects a rate adjustment of 4.5%; however, WM requests to use the West Urban index as it is more reflective of the inflationary cost pressures occurring in Utah. The West Urban index reflects 8% for the same period and is reflective in the Rate Exhibit attached.

Attached is the Rate Exhibit and West Urban and WST indexes, which demonstrates how we calculated the rate adjustments.

**WHEREAS**, Harrisville City (hereafter “City”) applied for and received certain Safe Sidewalks to School funds from the Utah Department of Transportation (hereafter “UDOT”) as specified in the Interlocal Agreement for this purpose;

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to enter the Interlocal Agreement with UDOT for the disposition and expenditure of said Safe Sidewalks to School funds in accordance with the proper policies and practices specified in the Interlocal Agreement negotiated for this purpose;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Harrisville City Council that the Interlocal Agreement, attached as Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby entered with UDOT for the purposed contained in said Interlocal Agreement. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to finalize any terms of the Interlocal Agreement and execute the Interlocal Agreement for and on behalf of the City.

## COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ by and between the UTAH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter referred to as UDOT, and HARRISVILLE CITY hereinafter referred to as the CITY.

### Recitals:

WHEREAS, the UDOT and the CITY want to install a Curb, Gutter and Sidewalk on 2000 North Harrisville, Utah referred to as Project # S -3457 (1 )0 and

WHEREAS, UDOT and the CITY desire to enter into this COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT for said improvements; and

WHEREAS, the UDOT has agreed to participate in the cost of installing the Project, up to \$157,460.16 and will reimburse the CITY, according to the terms herein, and

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT, is made to set out the terms and conditions where under said payment shall be made

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NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. The CITY will perform all work to install the sidewalk along 2000 North. or hire a contractor to do so.
2. Upon completion of the project the CITY will invoice UDOT for the completed work, up to \$157,460.16. Any fees above this amount will be the responsibility of the CITY

### **Total reimbursement to CITY is \$157,460.16**

3. The UDOT and the CITY are both governmental entities subject to the Utah Governmental Immunity Act. Each party agrees to indemnify, defend and save harmless the other from and against all claims, suits and costs, including attorneys' fees for injury or damage of any kind, arising out the negligent acts, errors or omissions of the indemnifying party's officers, agents, contractors or employees in the performance of this Agreement. Nothing in this paragraph is intended to create additional rights to third parties or to waive any provision of the Utah Governmental Immunity Act, provided said Act applies to the action or omission giving rise to the protections in this paragraph. The indemnification in this paragraph shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
4. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original, with the same effect as if the signatures thereto and hereto were upon the same instrument. This Agreement shall become effective when each Party hereto shall have received a counterpart hereof signed by the other Party hereto.
5. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Utah both as to

interpretation and performance.

6. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed, either by the parties hereto or by any third party, to create the relationship of principal and agent or create any partnership, joint venture or other association between the Parties.
7. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties, with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no statements, promises, or inducements made by either Party or agents for either Party that are not contained in this written Agreement shall be binding or valid.
8. If any provision hereof shall be held or deemed to be or shall, in fact, be inoperative or unenforceable as applied in any particular case in any jurisdiction or in all jurisdictions, or in all cases because it conflicts with any other provision or provisions hereof or any constitution or statute or rule or public policy, or for any other reason, such circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the provision in question inoperative or unenforceable in any other case or circumstance, or of rendering any other provision or provisions herein contained invalid, inoperative, or unenforceable to any extent whatever. The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses, or paragraphs herein contained, shall not affect the remaining portions hereof, or any part thereof.
9. Each party represents that it has the authority to enter into this Agreement.
